1. How long do you expect your internship to last? When do you plan to start and to end? When are you available for an interview in China?
2. Which place do you like to take your internship: Shanghai, Beijing, or Chongqing (They are only options)?
3. Have you given your personal information, such as your nationality, gender, age, hobby, etc? The most important thing, have you introduced your education background?
4. What kind of internship do you think is suitable for your degree thesis? Please specify two expected research fields. One is for the most preferred, and the other is for the option/backup.
5. Have you told sufficient information to demonstrate your research abilities? Please tell courses you have taken, projects, or any work you have done, as long as they are helpful to show you are qualified to enter the desired fields. Tomas' resume is good enough to be an example.

Some more explanations:

1. Our internship partner companies which might accept international students for their internships are Autodesk, eBay, HP, and Ericsson.
2. Positions opened to interns are about development, test, or technical support and service. And the interns are supposed to be engaged in a practical work, usually a module of a big project. It is usually pure technical work focusing on certain topic. Most probably no company will be able to provide a position for carrying on such a general and technical irrelevant research. .
3. Companies hope students to take the internship as long as possible. The minimum length of an internship should be 6 months, one year is better!
4. In order to let us know your process in internship, I think you should provide me with your internship conclusion reports at last for archives.
